MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

Immigrant Services Calgary's 2023-2024 fiscal year was one of change and growth. We completed our space transformation project, opened a new satellite location to ease client access to services, and sent a record-breaking 109,034 referrals to signed partners and community organizations to connect newcomers to vital programs.

The opening of the Gateway Newcomer Welcome Centre signified an important milestone in the Gateway transformation of the settlement sector, as we move the needle toward a more streamlined and collaborative way of serving newcomers in Calgary. We strengthened our relationship with the Francophone community and service providers by initiating French language assessments, published the inaugural issue of the Newcomer Knowledge Hub community magazine in collaboration with the University of Calgary's Faculty of Social Work, and launched an employment workshop series, in partnership with the Royal Bank of Canada, to increase newcomer employability.

Despite our successes, we cannot gloss over the challenges we faced as the consequences of global conflicts continued knocking on our doors. About one-third of the clients we served last year were people fleeing the war in Ukraine, and approximately 20 per cent of all client inquiries came from individuals who are not eligible for government-funded settlement services but require our support.

Alongside our sector partners, we grappled with funding shortfalls as we encountered a spike in demand for services and an increased number of newcomers found in shelters or precarious living conditions.

As our city and province faced an unprecedented number of newcomers settling into our communities, we remained steadfast in exploring new partnerships and growth opportunities to improve services for our clients and advocate on behalf of our community.

The work we accomplished last year would have been impossible without the support of our government funders, corporate and individual donors, and partners, who see the value of investing in our work, and the future of our communities. We are humbled by the commitment of our staff and volunteers, who are relentless in their pursuit of helping newcomers unleash their economic, social, and civic potential. Because of them, Immigrant Services Calgary supported more than 25,000 newcomers last year.

True and measurable impact takes a village—and ours is remarkable. Thank you, Calgary.



TRANSFORMING LIVES THROUGH GATEWAY



CREATING IMPACT THROUGH COLLABORATION

Newcomer Knowledge Hub

The Newcomer Knowledge Hub (K-Hub) is a partnership between Immigrant Services Calgary (ISC) and the University of Calgary (UCalgary), Faculty of Social Work.

Here is our collective impact in the 2023-2024 fiscal year:



Published the inaugural issue of our community magazine, Newcomer Research in Action.



Convened the first Dynamic Collaborative Group with academics, grantors, and service providers to discuss the ethics of research consent amongst newcomers.



Launched a Lunch & Learn series to close the gap between research and practice.



Delivered eight presentations and workshops at various immigration and settlement conferences.



Completed a research project on scaling digital transformation for better settlement outcomes of newcomers, in collaboration with the YMCA of Southwestern Ontario and Archway Community Services.



Developed five data dashboards to inform internal and partner data needs.

Job Fairs

Immigrant Services Calgary, alongside our partners in the Calgary Newcomers Collaborative (CNC) powered by Gateway, hosted two job fairs to connect newcomers to employment opportunities in Calgary.

Immigrant Arrival Centre

A partnership between the Calgary Newcomers Collaborative (CNC) powered by Gateway and the Calgary Airport Authority, the Immigrant Arrival Centre is a booth at the Calgary International Airport where newcomers can ask questions, seek support, and establish connections to services immediately upon arrival.

Our collective impact:

newcomers engaged and supported with urgent and long-term needs

Ukraine Response

Alongside our sector partners Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth, Centre for Newcomers, and The Immigrant Education Society, Immigrant Services Calgary worked tirelessly to offer on-the-ground supports to Ukrainian evacuees at various community touchpoints and targeted events, including government-funded hotels and the St. Vladimir Ukrainian Orthodox Church.

Our collective impact:

7,761

Ukrainian evacuees supported with access to housing, employment coaching, language resources, welcome orientation sessions, subsidized city service supports, and health care resources.

Gateway Newcomer Welcome Centre

In April 2023, Immigrant Services Calgary opened the new Gateway Newcomer Welcome Centre, where immigrants and refugees can easily access or be connected to the resources they need to build new lives in Calgary and Alberta. The centre was made possible thanks to support from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada, the Government of Alberta, Cenovus Energy, and Bank of Montreal.

Our collective impact:

22,272

newcomers accessed in-person services at the centre
